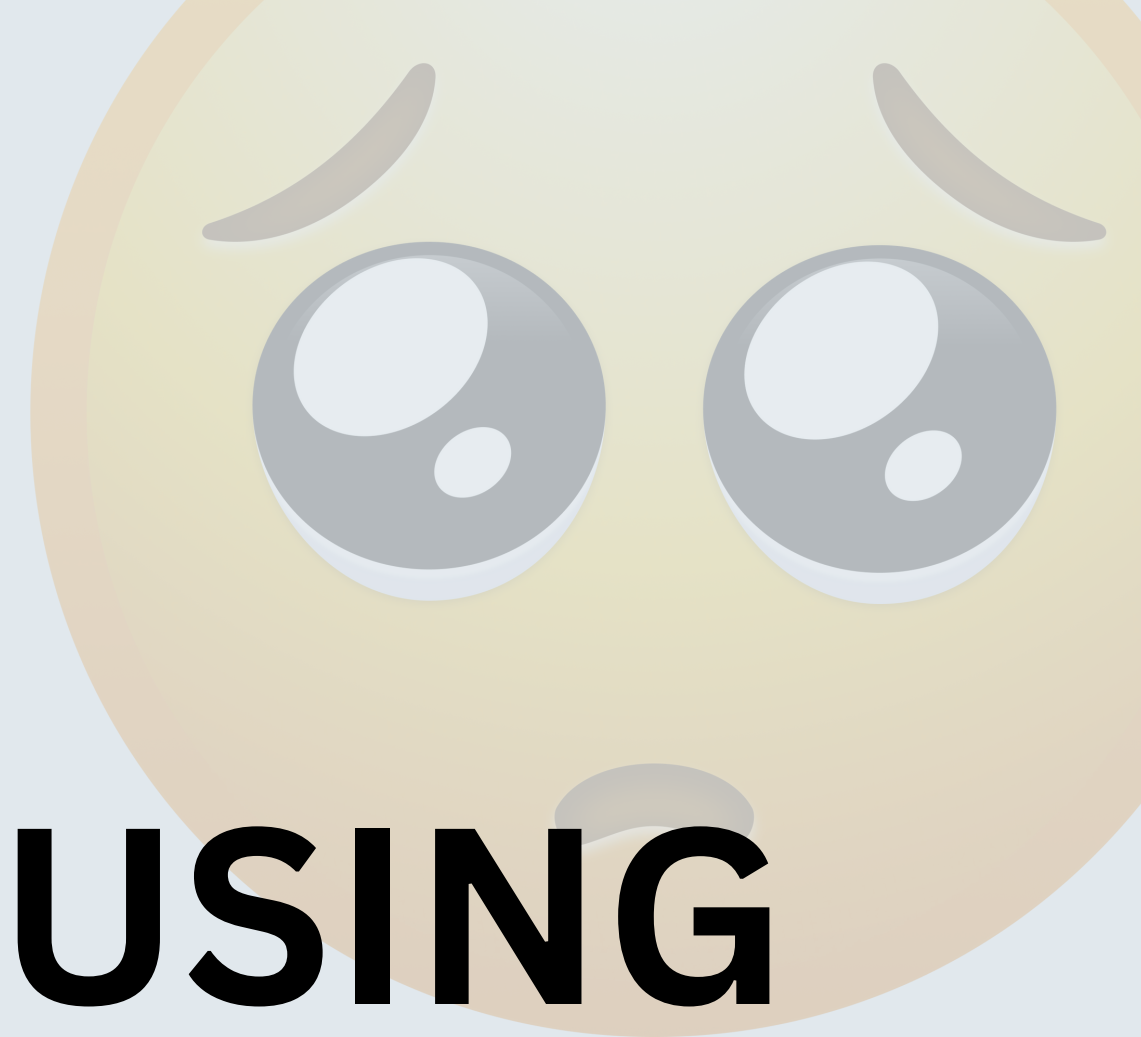


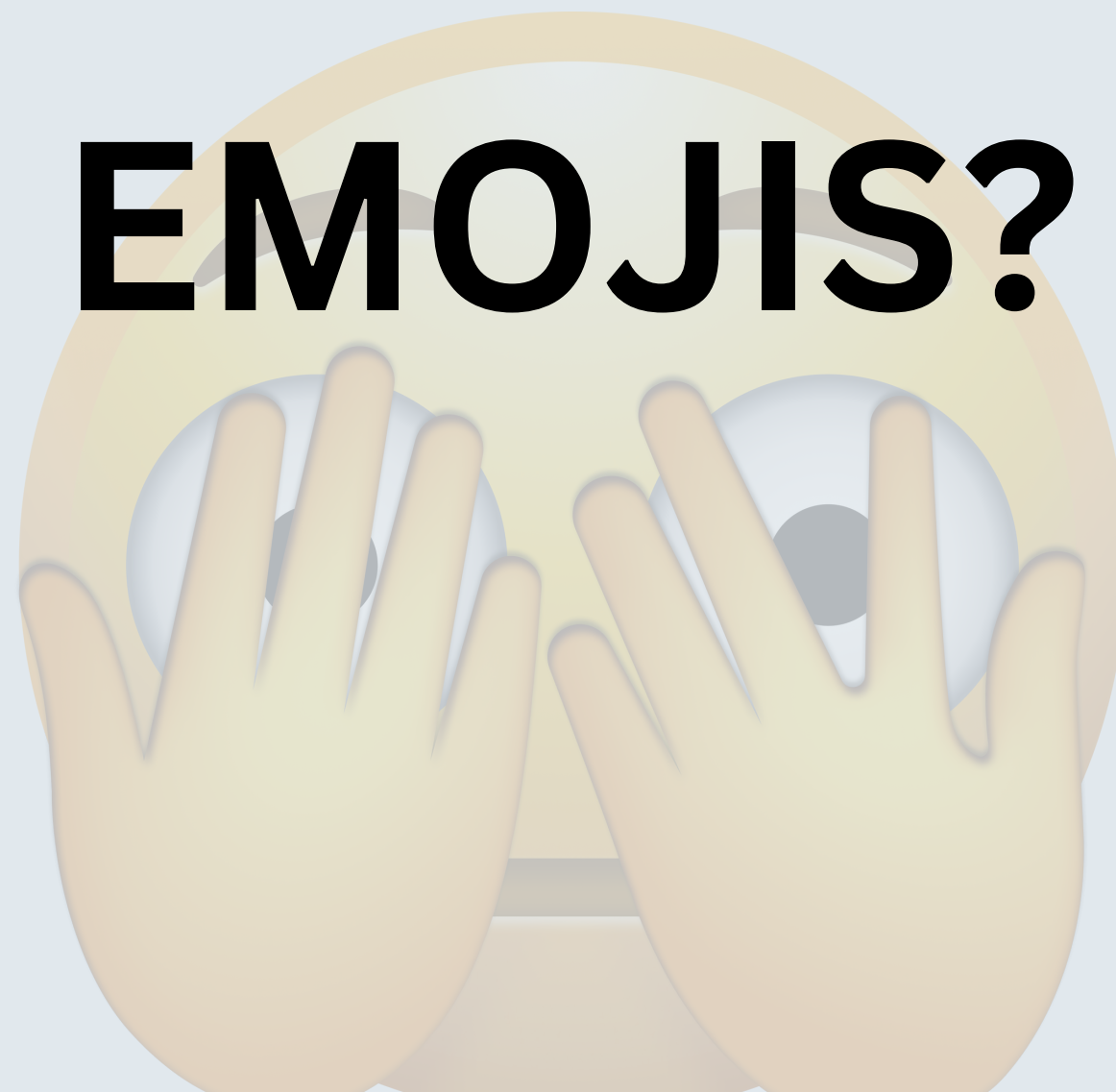

Here are some common emotions:

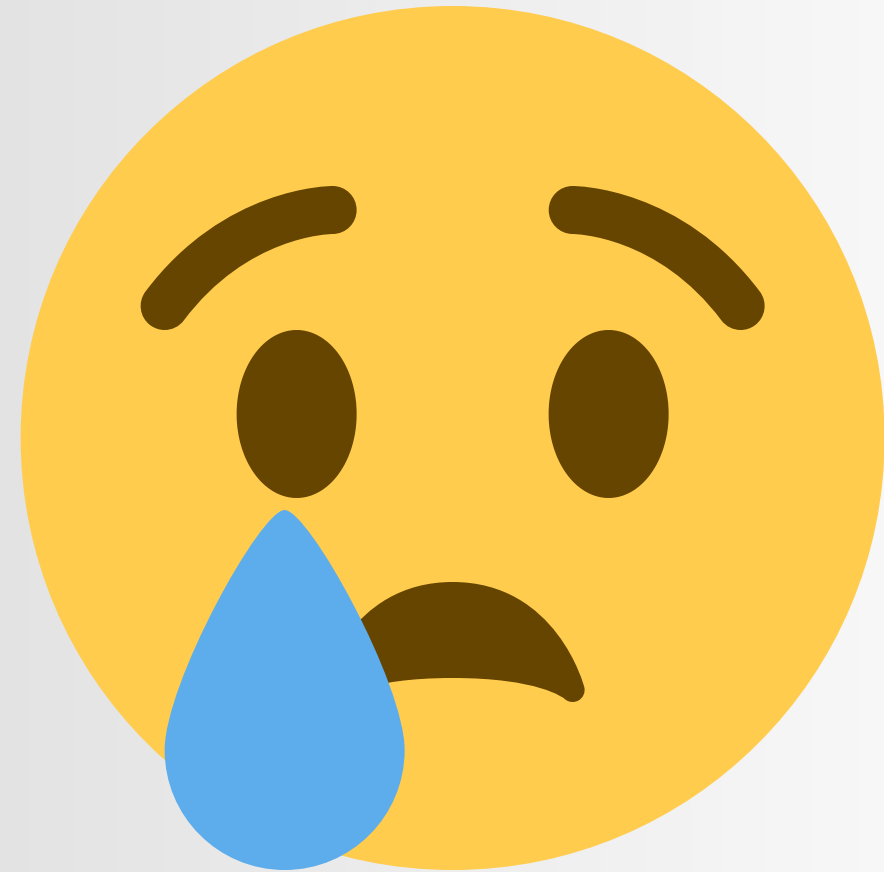
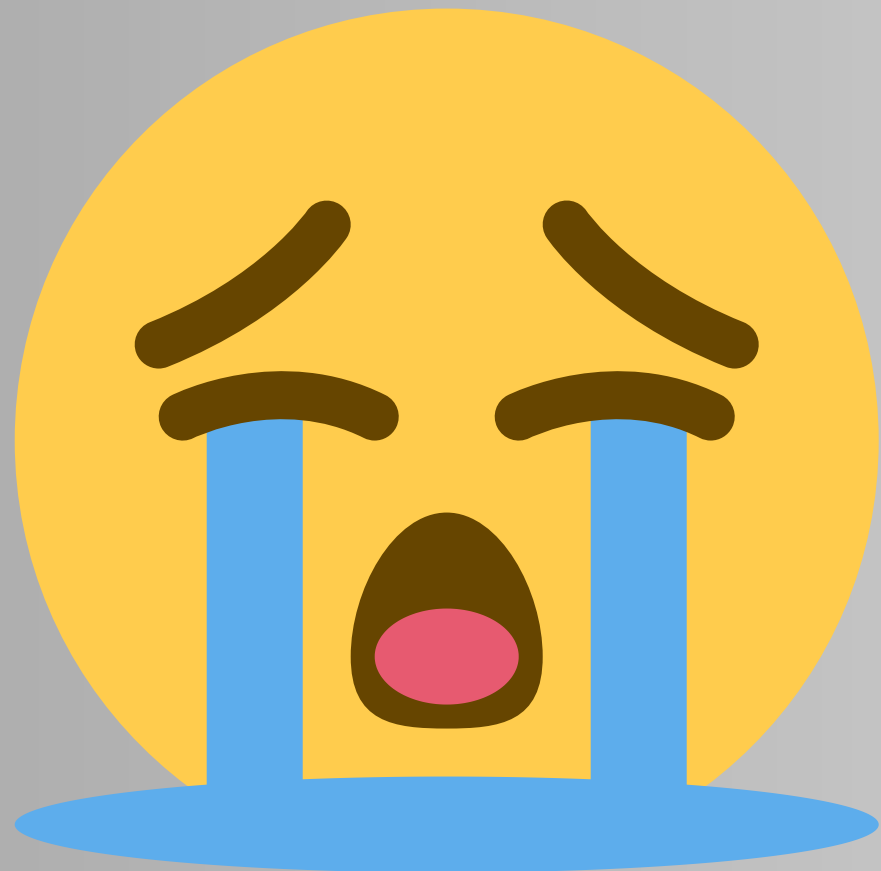
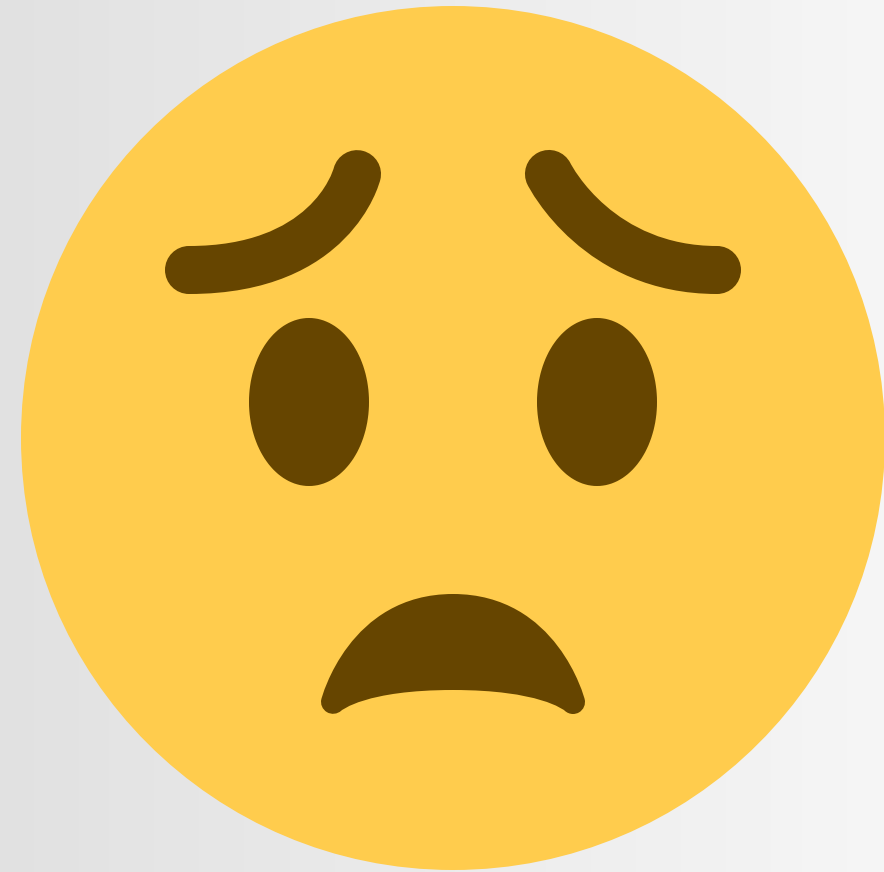
HAPPINESS:

A feeling of sorrow or unhappiness.



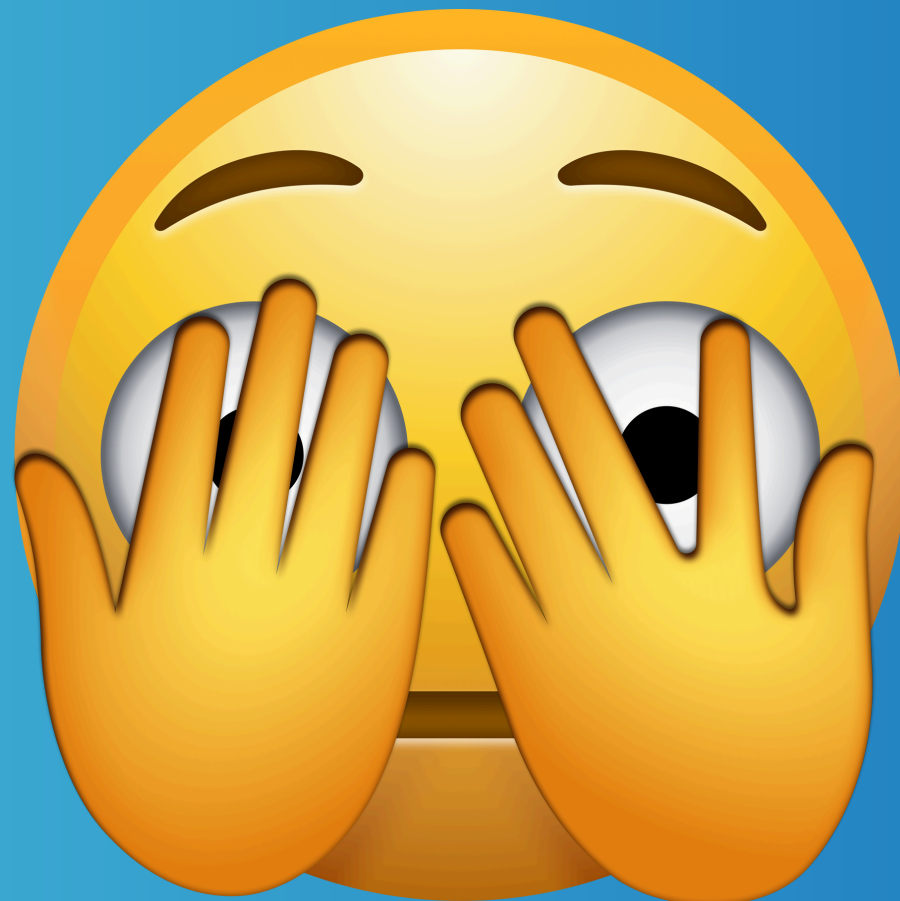
ANGER:

A strong feeling of displeasure or hostility.



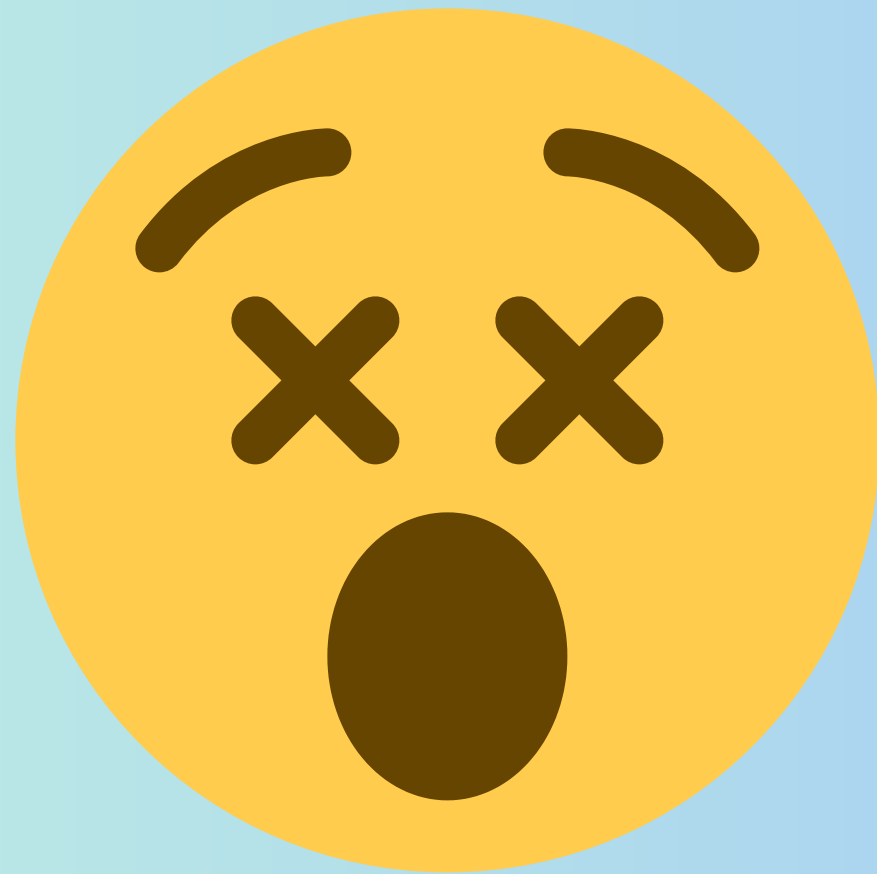
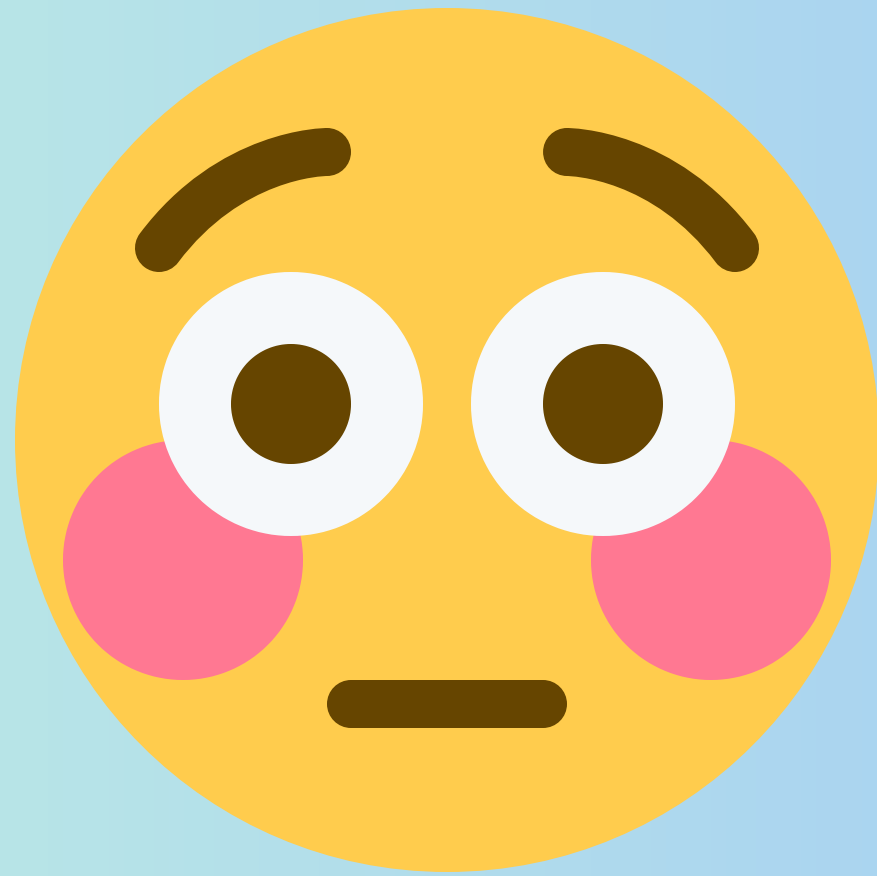
FEAR:

A feeling of shock or astonishment.



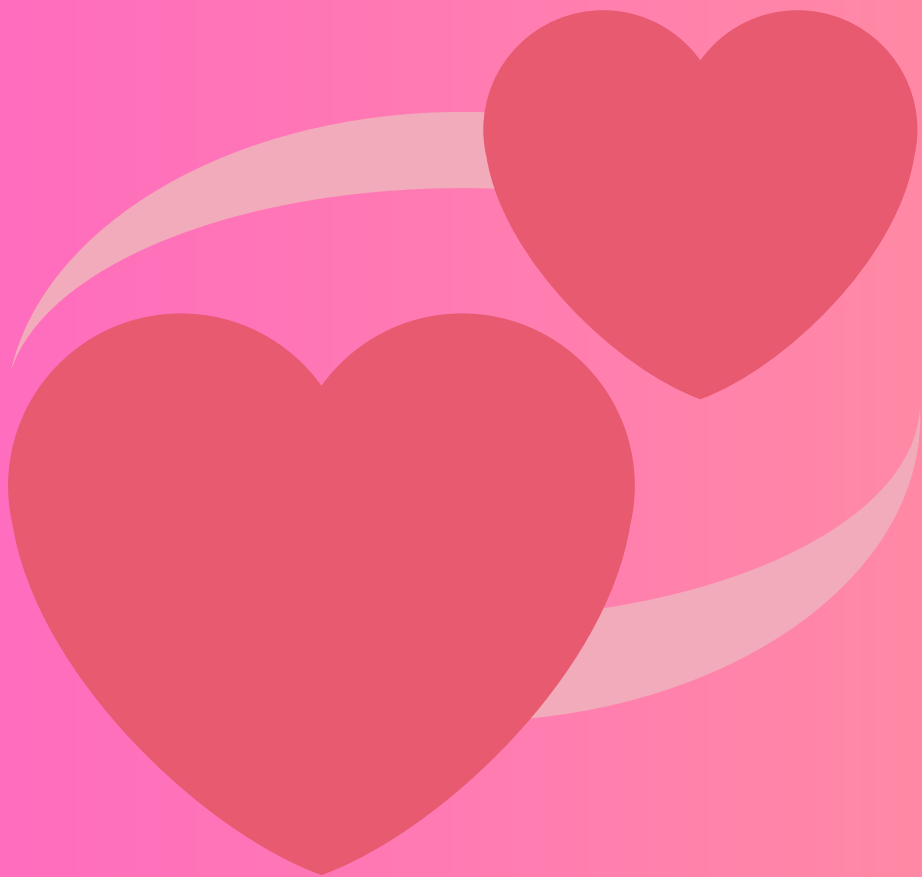
DISGUST:

A feeling of worry, nervousness, or unease.



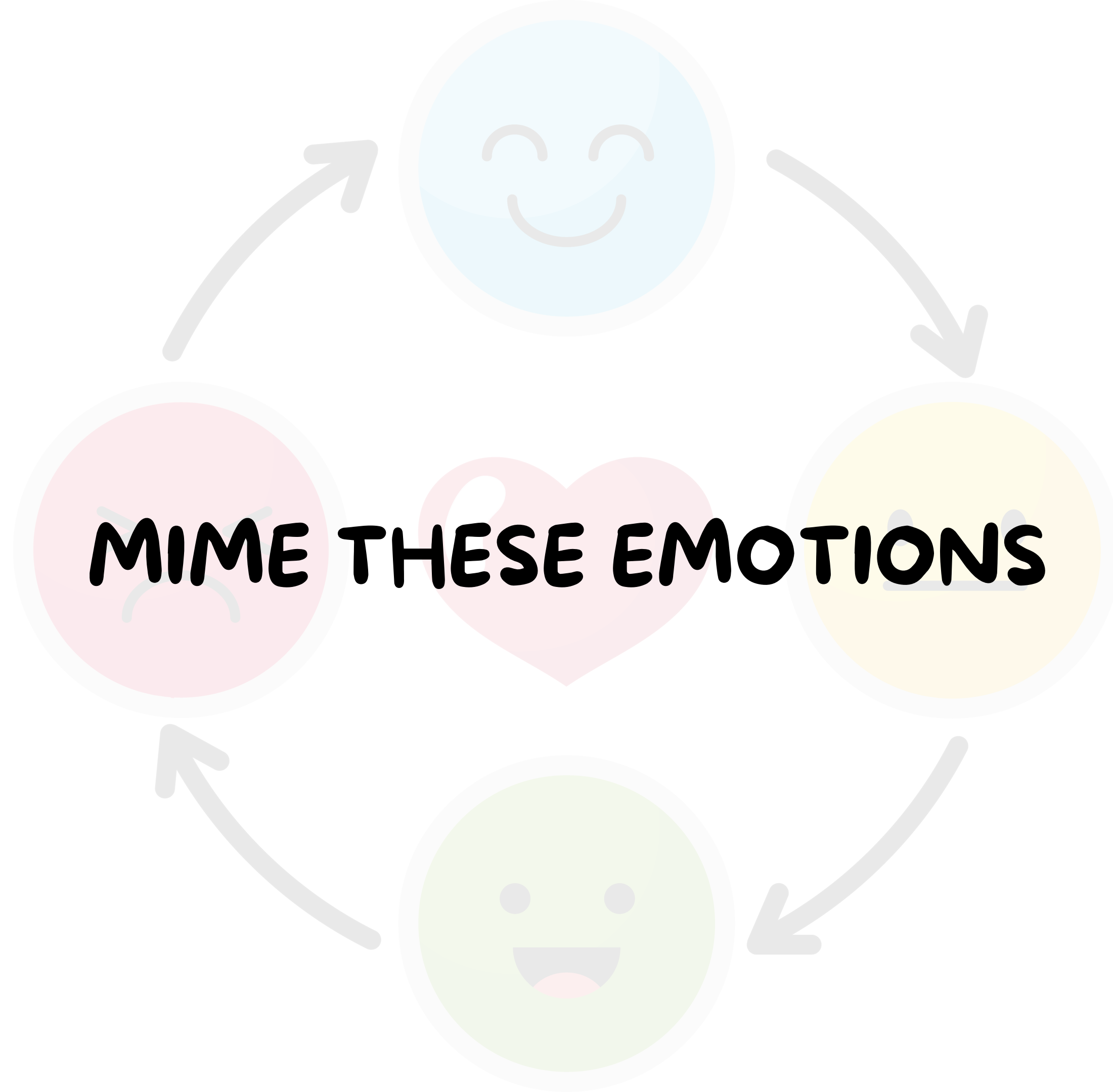
Which emotions are easier to share? Why?

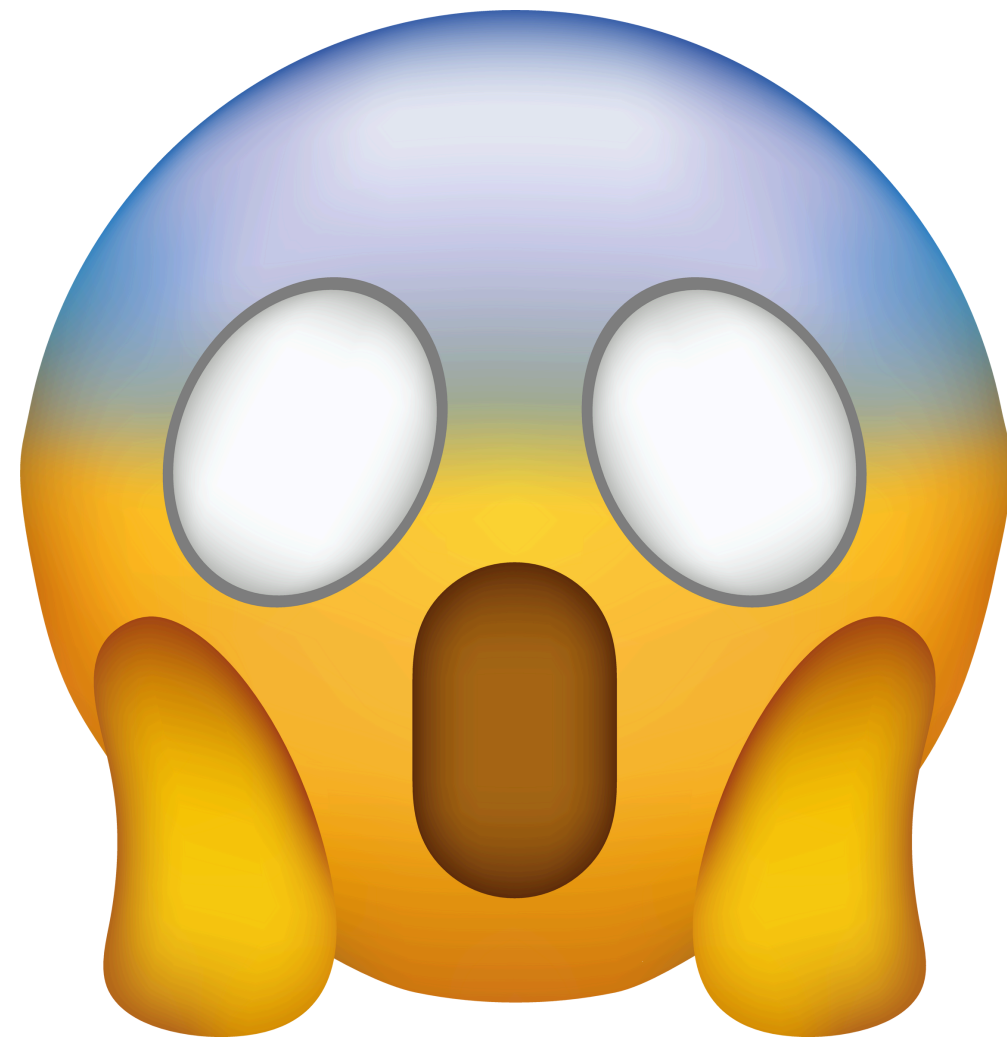

WHAT'S A CALLIGRAM?

Calligrams are artistic manifestations that link text and image in an intimate relationship that reinforces the meaning of the content of the poem or phrase.

It is a form of visual poetry which stands out by combining the arrangement of words with a graphic design that illustrates or reinforces the content.

The shape must represent the feeling visually.

For example:



Gratitude: a sunrise or a star, because they symbolize new beginnings.

Happiness: a sun shining or a flower, because they transmit energy and happiness.

HOW TO DRAW YOUR CALLIGRAM

STEP 1:

Think about the positive feeling. How do you feel it, which images or symbols do you connect it to and which colours do you think you should use?

STEP 2:

Choose a shape that symbolizes the emotion. Draw a simple draft to be able to see the shape you will choose.

STEP 3:

**Write your text on the
lines.**

STEP 4:

You can add visual details: using different sizes of your font or different colours, add words or short sentences which form decorative details.
